Wealth from Waste

Many Decades back, the resources were surplus for the mankind as the population was low. Now-a-days, due to increased population and increased standard of living, people require different products. So wealth from waste is one of the new pathways that is in place to satisfy different tastes. Latest development is in agriculture, especially in the coconut farms. It involves conversion of waste products into useful products. Years before, coir industries depended on coir produced from coconut husk. It was distributed throughout the country and even involved in export. China is the hub for the coir export for making beds, pillows and for even pith blocks that maintain the moisture content for longer time. Now the by-products produced from husk such as pith blocks, ropes and coconut husks were cut into small pieces and packed to export. Major export is pith blocks as it can be manufactured easily from waste of coir.

It involves low manufacturing cost. The water used for making these pith blocks could be recycled water. Srilanka also manufactures these pith blocks and other coir products but TamilNadu products are preferred by the buyers. People who don't find agricultural land for cultivation can also use this technology. This product plays a major role in agriculture market. This method of using the waste for growing plants has been appreciated by people from many countries. According to the current market trend, these pith blocks will play a major role in agriculture sector in the future.

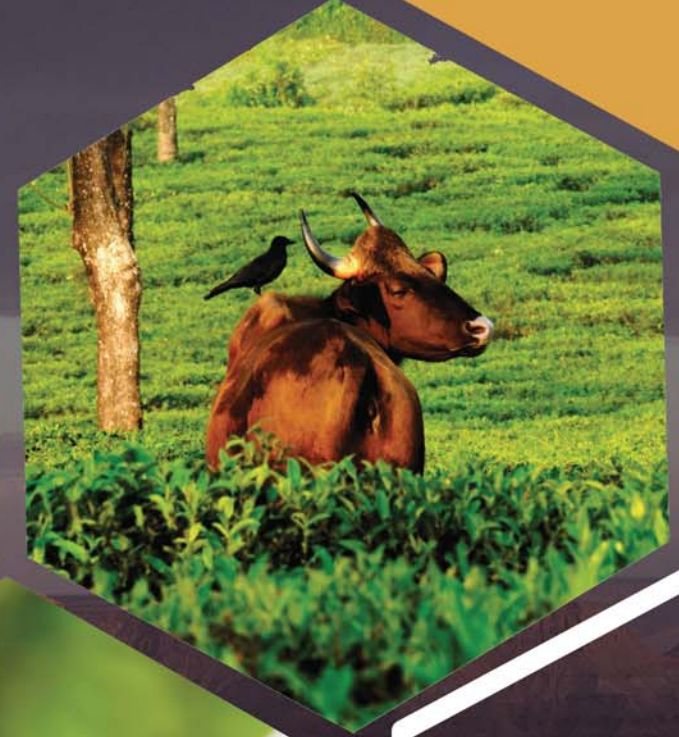

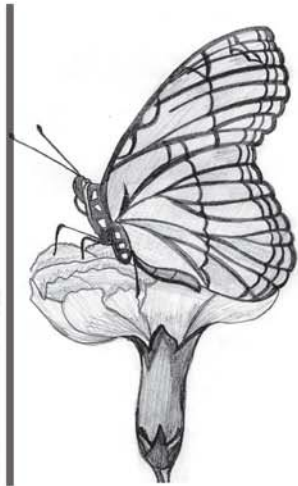
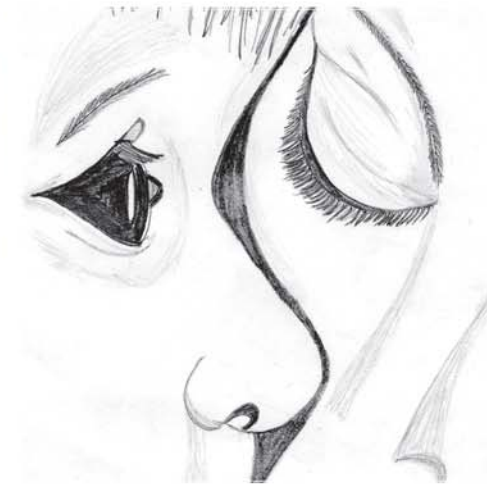
