



......Goooooooo











This will allow the scanners not only to unlock your device, but also to use it for authorizing payments using Android Pay offline world or within Play Store apps.

App links, also known as Intents, is a feature that helps you with all the app that could open a type of file. Normally our phone shows the apps installed in our mobile in opening that particular programme, for example — an image file; the entire app list that can open the link will be shown and you will be asked to choose the one you want to use.

One of the most common complaints faced by Android users is the standby times which are not regular on their phones. It happens due to the various apps running in the background, which in turn affect the standby time and performance. Google has introduced a feature called **Doze to take care of this issue**. This artificial intelligence technology learns your phones behavior over a period of time and detects the idleness of your mobile, to take it to a deep sleep mode.

Back up is something which everyone wants to have in case they have a problem, which was missing from Android for years, and it has taken some steps to rectify it finally. With Android 6.0, the backups can be set automatically, so that you don't need to worry about losing data, in case you have a problem with the device.


#### ANDROID FACTS

Android, Inc. was founded in Palo Alto, California in October 2003 by Andy Rubin (co-founder of Danger), Rich Miner (cofounder of Wildfire Communications, Inc.), Nick Sears (once VP at T-Mobile), and Chris White (headed design and interface development at WebTV) to develop, in Rubin's words, "smarter mobile devices that are more aware of its owner's location and preferences". The early intentions of the company were to develop an advanced operating system for digital cameras. Operated secretly, revealing only that it was working on software for mobile phones. That same year, Rubin ran out of money. Steve Perlman, a close friend of Rubin, brought him \$10,000 in cash in an envelope and refused a stake in the company. In July 2005, Google acquired Android Inc. for at least \$50 million.


