It was the last one on the list of IT giants which hires mechanical engineering students. I made the ‘Interview formals’ ready, arranged my files and went to bed.

4th October 2016- The Interview day: I woke up early that day since we had to go to Karpagam College, Coimbatore to attend the recruitment process. Javith took his car and we both were accompanied by three more friends. We reached Karpagam College around 8.10am and we met our fellow classmates there. It was more awkward to see all those child-like faces (interview etiquettes!).

I saw many of my friends departing the hall. I read the text on my screen. Congratulations. You have successfully completed the first round. Describe the below picture in 200 words. Click Start test when ready. My joy knew no bounds. I turned to my friend Manivannan nearby who grinned back at me. I looked back and found out that the gang which planned for the movie were sitting there inside the hall. Javith and Loki smirked at me. I relaxed for a few minutes and still couldn't believe that I made it to the next round.



**ROUND 2:** It was a picture based round in which we were asked to describe a picture in 200 words in a mere 15 minutes. As soon as I clicked Start test, an image was thrown up on the screen. It was a picture of a couple who seemed very happy and enjoying each other's company. Romeo and Juliet, Raman and Sita and few other name combinations came to my mind. I wasted nearly 5 minutes naming them and finally decided on Mark and Helen (I have no idea why I chose those names!). The round was very challenging since I deleted the lines and wrote back again trying to make it a best starter. I could write only about 150 words when the time ran out. I lost all my confidence there, done and dusted. We were then taken to the placement cell where the interview was supposed to take place. The HR read out the names from his laptop. 30 names were read and I felt that I am done for the day.

**Me:** Sure sir!

Thanking God for his mercy, I arranged my papers and waited for my turn.

**Technical Round:** Keeping myself calm (MSD movie impact!), I waited patiently for my turn. The clock struck 2 pm and the morning tea had already vanished in the thin air. A HR personnel came out with a stern face and enquired the job seekers whether they had their lunch. 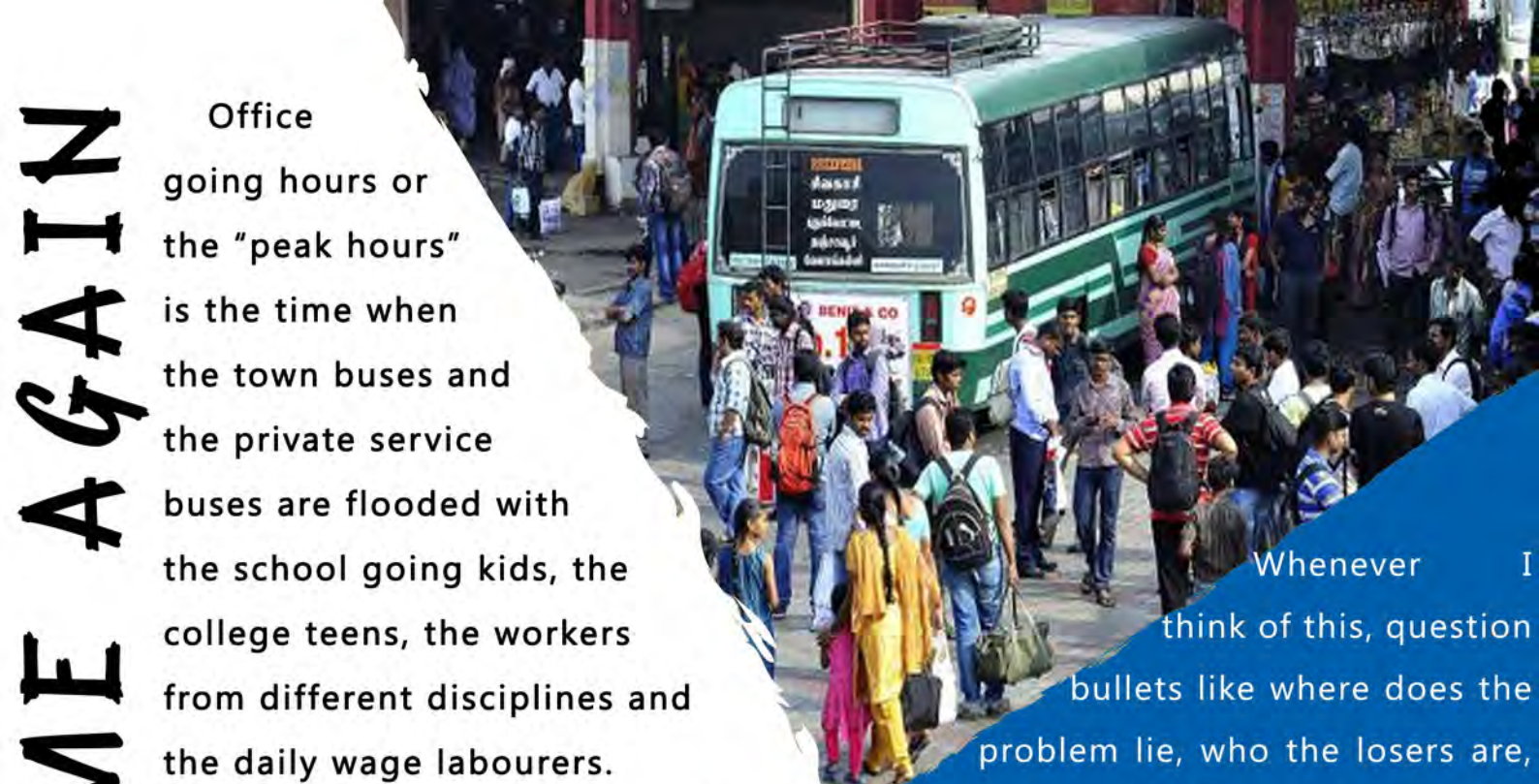
# TRAIN TRAIN TRAIN COME AGAIN

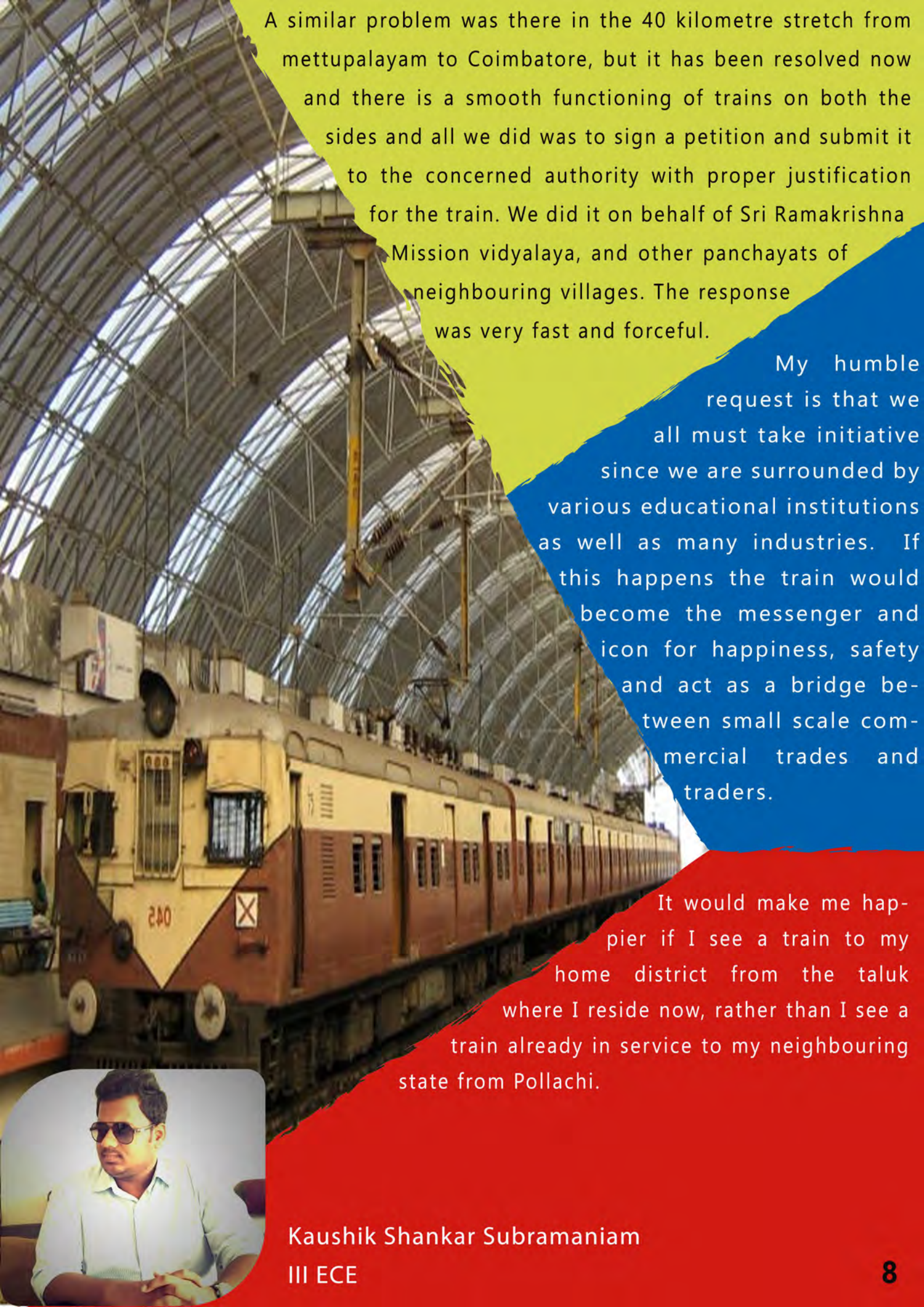
**IS OUR LIFE SO DISCOUNTED?**

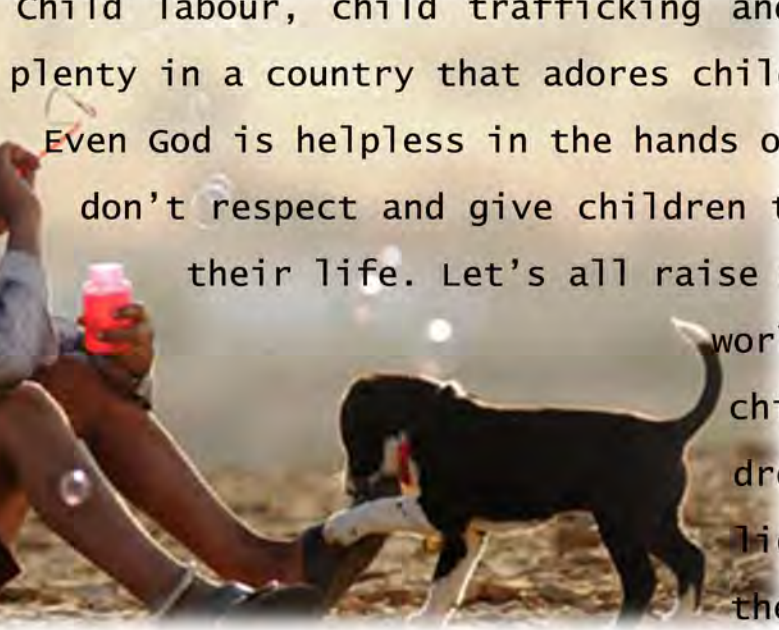

# FRIENDSHIP FOR SALE

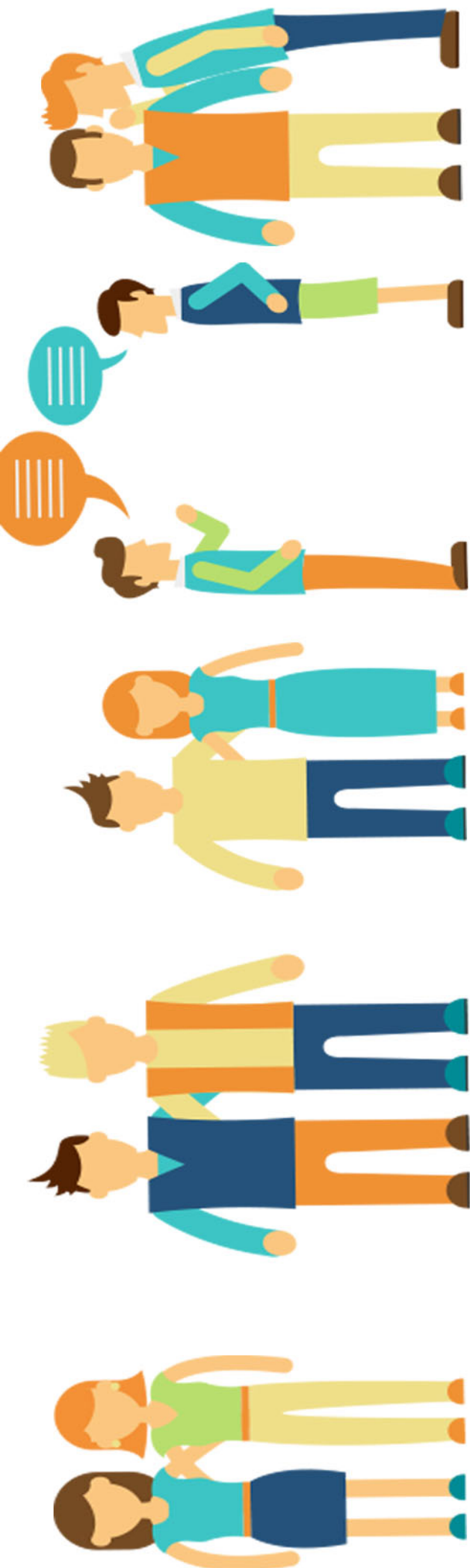
*“Walking with a friend in the dark is better than walking alone in the light”*
