AGRARIAN CRISIS IN INDIA

When we find news like "A farmer committed suicide", how many of us are embarrassed? How many of us feel bad for the former? How many of us show our solidarity to them? I hope, not many because it has become a regular incident in our country. Most of us watch and stay idle without raising our voices in social networking media, who otherwise talk about actors, politicians and movies. The society hasn't still realised that we need our farmers and farming lands to help us stay alive. The society hasn't realised that all our indigenous rice varieties are patented by the developed countries and cultivated there. They sell us back what they had taken from us. Doesn't it sound ridicu-Doesn't it sound irritating? lous? Doesn't it sound like we are preparing to become modern day slaves by killing our farmers and destroying our farming lands?

"The world has got enough things to satisfy everyone's need and not everyone's greed"

We are an agrarian society and the farmers make our living possible by providing us with food. As per the report of National Crime Records Bureau [NCRB], a department under the Central Government, which records and maintains the statistics of crime, approximately two lakks farmers have committed suicide over the last decade. Let us have a drive of information that may bring a paradigm shift in our thought process.

India is a nation where more than 50% of the population depends on Agriculture. We are known for Green Revolution, which made us self-sufficient in food production, but now, the scenario is entirely different and Indian agricultural sector has plunged into a deep crisis.



Dry monsoons and less profits have worsened the situation by forcing the farmers to sell their lands for minimum price because of the threatening from the real estate goons and political rowdies. The Minimum Support Price fixed by the government for agricultural products is not competitive and sufficient.

Financial assistance and subsidies available for them to buy seeds, fertilizers, etc are also insufficient due to which the farmers are forced to depend on private money lenders, who charge exorbitant rates of interest for loans. These farmers gradually get caught into dept traps. Ultimately, the financial burden tightens them and they are left with no other alternatives except suicide. This is because of their inability to repay the loan that they had raised for their crops and the brutality of the banks that punish them and leave people like Mallayya.



All the people who didn't repay billions of rupees from the banks were left untouched because all these people including the politicians, police and the bankers got money from these criminals but for a farmer for few thousands, few private banks have threatened and forced them to commit suicide.

The solution lies in the following

- 1. Minimum Support Price [MSP] for farmers should be increased significantly for their produce.
- 2. Interposer between the farmers and the buyers should be eliminated.
- 3. Farmers' Market in which the cultivators can sell their produce directly to the consumers [as inthe case of Tamil Nadu] should be promoted in all the states.
- 4. Increased Financial assistance at subsidised rate of interest should be made available to the farmers for buying seeds, fertilizers and other requisite needs.
- 5. Think of some innovative ideas to join the rivers and provide enough water.



I appeal all of you to voice your opinion for our farmers and support the campaign of linking the rivers. Next time when you see a farmer, atleast respect them.




This was essentially the plan of the Aryan Kings who ruled


Caste and economy

Three apples changed this earth's fate to a great extent in the fields of religion, science and technology. The first was the apple from Adam and Eve's time, Second one from Newton's time and the third one is Steve Jobs' apple. Every time Apple introduced a new product, the whole world would queue from previous night. The Reed college dropout, challenged the whole concept of formal education and brought out one of the best products that the world had ever seen. Apple has become the name of status quo for people and those who had an apple product always carried a self-esteem with them but for others, they looked



like they are head weights.

t's time for the venerated MacBook Pro line-up to get some fresh blood. An event by Apple arrived on Thursday October 27th with a simple slogan "Hello again", means it won't have to wait long and echoed the "Hello" from the first Mac launch back in the eighties. If you were expecting new Mac hardware from Apple after that, you are right. Apple's plans are becoming crystal clear, and fans of the MacBook better check your bank accounts because the expected update to the MacBook Pro line-up is almost ready. KGI Securities Ming-Chi Kuo has issued a report that Apple is preparing to reveal a MacBook Pro which continues the ethos of dropping ports and old solutions and will launch three new models, a thirteen-inch Mac-Book Pro, a fifteen-inch MacBook Pro, and a new 13-inch MacBook.

The key feature on the new MacBook Pros will be a context-sensitive touchscreen that will replace the physical function key strip. This will give access to popular commands and quick actions that can be determined on an app-by-app basis.



The laptops are also expected to pick up Touch ID to verify a user's identity. Other analysts believe that Apple will trim down the various ports on the hardware, dropping mag-safe and relying primarily on USB-C for connectivity and power (backed up by Thunderbolt 3 depending on the model). Last year's new arrival, MacBook, the twelve-inch device provided to be a lightweight and highly portable laptop. Ming-Chi Kuo believes that this year's MacBook model will bump up the screen size to thirteen inches, although there are no further details. Presumably the specifications of the MacBook Pro will be sufficient to differentiate the two new machines in the market place.

He also noted that the new iMacs and external displays are unlikely to be revealed at the event, but if they are announced, he told that people should wait till the second half of 2017.

Technology is learnt by experiments and not by mere college degrees. There is a huge gap between the industries' expectations and the educational institutions' programmes. Although lots of efforts are taken now-a-days to bridge this gap interms of new curriculm and infrstructure, the faculty members who deliver it remain the same without much update, the students should be given enough time to work on their own, rather than dumped in the class-rooms, just to listen few boring lectures that doesn't even involve the students' participation. Let's hope future will bring us better curriculum, better faculty members and participatory classrooms.







Artificial intelligence

Talk of the world is Artificial Intelligence as more movies have started projecting Artificial Intelligence and Robotics as essentials of the future. The technology world is very positive about the applications of robotics and artificial intelligence in fields such as medical, space etc. Skeptics say that machines might turn this world into pieces like it is shown in some of the movies as they don't have any emotions.

According to a standard definition by encyclopedia.com, Artificial intelligence (AI) is a field within computer science that seeks to explain and emulate all aspects of human intelligence through mechanical or computational processes. Typical areas of research in AI include video games, natural language understanding, problem solving, learning, and robotics.





Aleem Siddiqui, a Computer Consultant says that finally, some researchers see intelligence as a quality that can only be acquired and demonstrated through relationship with other intelligent beings. Each of these understanding of intelligence has been used as the basis for an approach in developing computer programs with intelligent characteristics. Researchers have developed an artificial intelligence capable of recreating physics experiments that won the 2001 Nobel Prize for Physics. The AI system was able to recreate the complex quantum experiment to create an extremely cold gas trapped in a laser beam, known as a Bose-Einstein Condensate. (BEC)

Scientists want to create BECs to use them as cold-atom based sensors and to investigate many body physics, among the many other uses. Because they are super-sensitive to external disturbances, they can take very precise measurements of things, like tiny changes in the Earth's magnetic field or gravity. With AI, a BEC system could be set up quickly each morning and the machine would compensate for any overnight fluctuations, allowing it to be taken out into the field. It's cheaper than taking a physicist everywhere with you. The researchers also found that AI came up with ways to create BEC that surprised them. The earth took millions of years to take shape and it took millions of years for the humans to evolve but the pace at which the technology develops is tremendous. There are technology updates every 30 minutes and there are new technologies coming up almost every day. The important thing is that we need to keep in touch with the nature because few people create technology and billions of people get addicted to it. Note that there are many things that we don't know but we can learn stuff by doing what you did just now. Reading.


