According to Dr. Ibrahim Alladin, Dr.N.Mahalingam will be revered for many of his achievements but one thing which will stand out from the others is that he revived Saint Ramalinga Vallalar, and brought out his teachings on Jyoti (Excerpt from 'A Living Legend').

The celebration is for five to eight days from 1st of October. Eminent orators, Gandhians, Spiritual Leaders are invited to speak about the philosophies of Gandhi and Vallalar at AVM Rajeswari Kalyana Mandapam in Radhakrishnan Salai, Chennai. Thanks to Shri A.V. Meiyappa Chettiar's family for permitting to use the hall free of cost for this auspicious and noble cause of highest order.

Arutchelvar had relentlessly organized the function year after year for over 60 years and continued to keep his resolution alive harping on his commitment to uphold the principles of the two righteous incarnations. Blessed are the souls that have the privilege of joining the Divine Power while involved in serving the Supreme, Arutchelvar is one such holy soul who breathed his last while listening to the discourse at Gandhi-Vallalar Vizha on 2nd October, 2014.

A leader is one who sees things that others don't. While the very next year's function was planned by Dr. Manickam who inherited the services through Ramalingar Panimandram. He had a different plan as he did not want this to continue as a function for the few senior citizens who still cherish their memory of Gandhiji and Vallalar, but wanted to reach the digital generation that is in the schools today.

He launched a state level literary competition for school and college students through Ramalingar Panimandram. The state is divided into eight zones and a zonal level competition is held among an average of 4000 students every year. The zonal level winners are awarded with cash prize and subsequently 100 best talents are identified to exhibit their talents at the State Level Competition held at Gandhi-Vallalar Vizha in Chennai. Eventually, the winners receive accolades and an opportunity to participate in a 2-day workshop arranged at MCET, Pollachi to fine tune their raw talents.

Dr. M. Manickam's objective was to spread the good words of Gandhiji and Vallalar to the younger generation. After two years of launching this competition, what brings pride and contentment to the organizers is the feedback from the young participants which says, "Although we started to learn about Gandhiji and Vallalar with the motivation to showcase our talent and to win the cash prize, we cannot deny the fact that this process has created a consciousness about the noble thoughts and principles of Gandhiji and Vallalar among youngsters like us. This not only created awareness but a desire to follow their teachings in our life." Students take it as an honour and pride to receive appreciation from a legendary family.

ONLINE TRANSACTIONS

Online digital transactions, the new trend in the digital world is a revolution. Although it makes life easier, it also brings loss to companies and customers alike. Now-a-days, transferring money, recharging a mobile, making payments for all household utilities (such as gas, electricity, etc..) are just a matter of seconds. The only requirement for doing this is a working internet connection and that's all, we are set to go.

Most of us do not know what works at the backend once we click the pay/transfer button although we all use it everyday. Once we click the pay button, our web browser tries to communicate with the web server (a place where all the contents and information of the website is stored). The web server takes the card/account details from the website and secures the data by using SSL certificate which prevents intruders from viewing the information. The web server doesn't store the card/account information of the users until the user grants access. The web server then routes the information to the gateway which is the heart of every transaction. The gateway is nothing but an authorisation which consists of links to card companies/particular banks to check, whether the entered information is correct/not. The bank/card comauthorize whether the transaction panies then can be proceeded for debiting/crediting from the user's account. Once the gateway gets a reply, it accepts/declines the transactions and based on the validity, it performs the transactions and displays the status. This process takes place within fraction of seconds and hence it is fast and convenient. It is fully automated without any manual work involved.



Apart from all the advantages, there lies series of disadvantages that make the digital world little scary. The first issue that everyone faces is that money getting deducted from bank account and the customer not getting any message from the gateway for authorisation. This occurs, when the servers hang or when we have poor internet connection. This is mainly because of high network traffic at the same time, which the servers can't handle. Hence a better way to avoid this, is to ensure that we have proper internet speed before making a payment online. We should also ensure that the payment gateway has proper relationship with the banks, so that, if money gets deducted from the bank without the gateway's authorisation, we can still request the bank to refund it.

SHOPPING BUY MONEY BANKING COMMERCE

The next issue is security. All the details of the customers are stored in a bank database and if the database gets hacked, the information coud be stolen and leaked and this may lead to serious financial problem for the customers. So, always ensure that the bank system has proper security back up, before registering with it. Another problem is electricity. This is similar to the internet server hanging problem. When electricity/power/charge goes off, the transaction gets paused and we won't be able to resume it and refunding process will become a nightmare thereafter.

So, always ensure that there is sufficient power back up before making a transaction to avoid losing money. Banks and card companies keep inviting people to open a bank or get a card but they have an Indian habit of not involved in after sale service. This has affected almost everyone in the country and this is becoming very serious in this technology packed world. Taking enough security measures to safegaurd the savings and transactions should be the primary objective of the financial service providers apart from their sole objective of profit.

These are the main issues that the customers face when they make online transactions. I have tried to explain the working of an online transaction and its effects briefly. My request to everyone is that before making an online transaction check for every point mentioned above to avoid losing money. Please ensure that you make payments only via authorised gateway/bank websites. People are still running behind banks and card companies to recover money stolen from their bank/card. At times, we may need to spend more money in the process of recovery than that we lost.

SMART CONVEYOR 4.0

We, a team of students from final ICE, participated in the second Mitsubishi Electric Cup Pune, conducted by Mitsubishi Electric India Private Limited held at college of engineering, Pune. The competition was announced during the month of July 2016 and we submitted the abstract for the competition during the month of August 2016. Our team, WORKER BEES was selected in the preliminary rounds from among various teams all over India. We attended a training on PLC and HMI for a week at Coimbatore in September 2016, after we were shortlisted for the main competition. We were also given components worth rupees 1.5 Lakhs. We attended a training on Servo in Bangalore for 2 days in December 2016. Finally, we participated in the competition in February for 3 days. The competition gave us a wonderful experience and we got an opportunity to interact with various industrial experts. At the final day of the competition, our team secured fifth place among all the teams from all over India and secured first place in south India.

CONCEPT OF THE PROPOSED MODEL

When the system is powered ON through MCB, the conveyor starts rotating. The conveyor is driven by the servo motor. The conveyor rotates at the speed which is programmed in PLC for servo motor. The objects are loaded on to the conveyor. The objects start moving along the conveyor and it is guided to the optical sensor range which counts the number of objects passing in the conveyor. They are guided by the metallic guide placed above the conveyor.

When the object reaches the inductive sensor, the conveyor stops only if the component is metallic, else the conveyor does not stop and runs continuously until the component reaches its storage.

INTRODUCTION



This proposed method designs smart conveyor using internet of things (IoT). The Conveyors are used to transfer materials from one destination to another destination, thus reducing the time and man power. Conveyor machines are popularly utilized in the field of product handling and packing business. Conveyors have gained worldwide recognition because of their amazing benefits. They bring improved efficiency as well as essential safety because of hands free operation. In this work, design of smart conveyor based on Internet of Things (IoT) is proposed to enhance efficiency and safety.

Whenever the conveyor stops sensing a metallic object, the pick and placer gets activated. The pick and placer move towards the component and picks the metallic component by using vacuum generator and suction cup. The pick and placer drops the component into the funnel which guides the component to the path of the storage area.

The optical sensor is placed at the bottom of the funnel. When the optical sensor senses the component, the first cylinder among the three pneumatic double acting cylinder gets input and pushes the component through the path and activates the limit switch at the other end. This enables the second cylinder and activates the second limit switch at the other end and finally the second limit switch enables the third cylinder and moves the component in to the storage area of the metallic components. The other sensor named PIR is used for the human safety. Whenever the human interfere the conveyor, the sensor gets enabled and the conveyor stops suddenly and it indicates an alarm. By enabling the internet and raspberry pi all the data of the conveyor are viewed on the website. So, the conveyor is controlled using IoT via raspberry pi.




