
BEING HAPPY AND LIVING IN THE PRESENT

THE LANGUAGE DEBATE


We are all familiar with the quote "words travel worlds, translators are the drivers". India is the most diverse country in many aspects. Language plays a central and definite role in the diversity of India. There is no national language as declared by the Constitution of India, still, Hindi is used for official purposes such as parliamentary proceedings, judiciary, communications between the Central Government and the State Governments. States within India have the liberty and power to specify their own official language, through legislation and therefore, there are 22 officially recognized languages in India, of which Hindi is the most used.

Even though no Indian language (not English) was ever declared as the national language, Hindi could be the only choice based on the demographics. Now, the country's only problem lies in conducting exams such as UPSC, GATE etc. because most of the candidates who appear for these exams are not able to overcome the difficulty of English and most of the candidates from South India were not happy with the dominance of Hindi in setting the question papers. As per the 2001 census, around 42.2 crore people listed Hindi as their mother tongue, of which 25.79 crore spoke Hindi in its pure form, and another 16.41 crore in 49 mother tongues similar to Hindi. Overall, around 41.03% of the population has declared Hindi or its sub-groupings as its mother tongue.

THE LANGUAGE DEBATE

According to the new government, all the officials and employees should be well-versed in Hindi and all the government offices in India will have a Hindi software installed in their systems. The Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) is all set to promote Hindi as the official language. Since India is a multilingual and multi-racial country, this holds true for every state throughout the nation. Starting right from North i.e. Kashmir to down south i.e. Kanyakumari, one can easily witness this phenomenon. As you navigate the entire length and breadth of the country, the linguistic diversity is evident and the pattern and tone also differs within a short distance even if people are speaking the same dialect.




Out of these, as many as 94 languages are spoken by less than 10,000 people each and 23 languages together account for 77 percent of the total population of the country. According to some scholars, the total number of languages and dialects in our country is about 700 (nearly 175 languages and 550 dialects). Out of these, as much as 22 languages are recognised as national languages of the country as they are included in the eighth schedule of the constitution. Even though Hindi remains the apt language to communicate in India and unite the country, we have to respect every language and give equal importance to all the Indian languages for the development and happiness of the country. Hence, this is the right time for the government and all

the responsible citizens of the country to come up with an acceptable decision.

So, to solve the problem of language in national level exams, the government should adopt bilingual pattern, in which either English or Hindi could be given as a choice. In addition to that, a candidate should be given the opportunity to write the exam in his/her own mother tongue. At the same time, question paper setters should also take extreme care while translating the questions from English to any other language so as to avoid any deviations in the meaning of the questions.



To unite the country as one, Hindi might sound an appropriate language for the Indian sub-continent but not at the expense of all the other regional languages that carry their own rich heritage and culture. Every language has its own heritage and culture, therefore, it is the responsibility all citizens to respect and promote Indian languages irrespective the state and religion they belong to. Schools and colleges have higher responsibilities to educate students regarding the importance of learning multiple languages and the diverse nature of our country. So, it becomes one of the most important, yet, most difficult decision the government may need to take which would safeguard the interests of all the languages and cultures in the country.



SHAME THE RAPISTS

"OUR LIVES BEGIN TO END THE DAY WE BECOME SILENT ABOUT THINGS THAT MATTER."

I happened to watch a TED Talk as part of our Communication Skills session, in which Ms. Sunitha krishnan explained the importance of raising our voices against sexual harassment. She also shared her experience of educating people regarding sexual harassment and the aftermath of such incidents. This talk showed her anger and anguish about a video she came across on 4th February 2016, in which a 17 years old girl was raped by five men in the middle of the forest. When Sunitha watched this video, she was Stunned and shocked because those criminals didn't have a glimpse of the crime they were committing. She told that these criminals, while committing such grave criminal activities, feel proud of their ugly work because they know that they could just get away with that. The worst part was that they shared the video in all the social networking sites.



Although this was seen by many people, no one cared about the video and the girl. She was not able to show her anguish and anger, so, she started a campaign, "SHAME THE RAPIST" in social media. She shared few vital information from her internet research on 9 similar videos within 24 hours. When she approached the police station nearby, they sent her back by saying that the place is not under their jurisdiction.

SHAME THE RAPISTS

This happened somewhere in the north but she didn't left the issue in the middle. She didn't want to give this as a reason to give-up on the issue. She then approached the ministry of home affairs and for some time there was some sound afterwards there was silence. Although she filed a case in the Supreme Court later, she wished that this case be taken over by the CBI for further investigation. Her major demands to the Supreme Court were the following,

SUO MOTTO where a government agency acts independently, without anyone's pressure. This would make sure that there is no political, money or power influence that would otherwise weaken the agency.

HANDING ALL NINE VIDEOS TO CBI — She wanted the CBI to take control of all the nine videos that would act as the prime evidence against the criminals who harassed and raped women. CBI will act without the influence of the state politics, thus would help the victims get at least delayed justice.

NATIONAL SEX OFFENDERS REGISTER – She wanted the register of National Sex Offenders to be maintained strictly. This would help the law enforcing agencies to control, monitor and prevent future crimes.

TASK FORCE – She wanted a special force against sexual harassment be formed on State and Central level that would fight these cold blooded criminals and nail them in front of the law. This she thought would be public friendly and will have more accountability as the members would be of the general public and would act ethically. The good thing is that she won the case, at last.



SHAME THE RAPISTS

Now that the CBI started investigating the case, they identified the people in one of the videos. On 20th March 2017, CBI arrested three men form a company who raped the worker of their company. They had also uploaded the video in social media. The three men named Dev, Kaushik and Sahu were brought in front of the law and sentenced. Later, CBI found the one who uploaded the other videos in internet and the culprit was just a 19 years old boy form Bangalore who also had 479 similar videos in his computer. He was also sentenced to imprisonment.

INDIA is the largest consumer of this kind of videos and these coupled with the high speed internet, generous availability of mobile phones in the hands of the adolescents and the freedom this generation has without any responsibility leads them to involve ion such acts. Parents are too busy earning, society is too busy bringing new life styles and companies are too busy selling their products that makes the young generation vulnerable to all the modern crimes the society faces today. Even the closest relations, friends and other acquaintances involve in these acts which has spread a new fear in the society. We may try the following steps to prevent future incidents such as open campaign against rape and rapists, severe punishments for these crimes, teach our children to respect women and finally treat women as human beings and equals.

I withdraw from people and places from time to time. I need space from a world that is filled with millions of mouths that talk too much but never have anything to say.


