MASTER OF CEREMONIES

“Where have you been? We can feel the vacuum in your absence”, said an English professor when I arrived at college for the preparation of my last master of ceremonies of my college life. I got to watch videos of yesteryear Tamil master of ceremonies and then I got to know how important it was, to create a unique style of carrying the function without lagging. It is also important to know that the audience should not feel the master of ceremonies was underplayed or overpowered. There should be a measured balance between when to speak and when to not.



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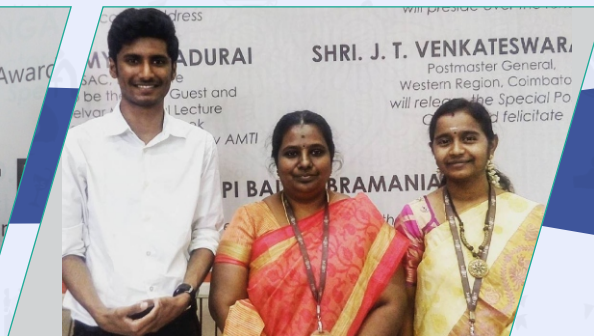
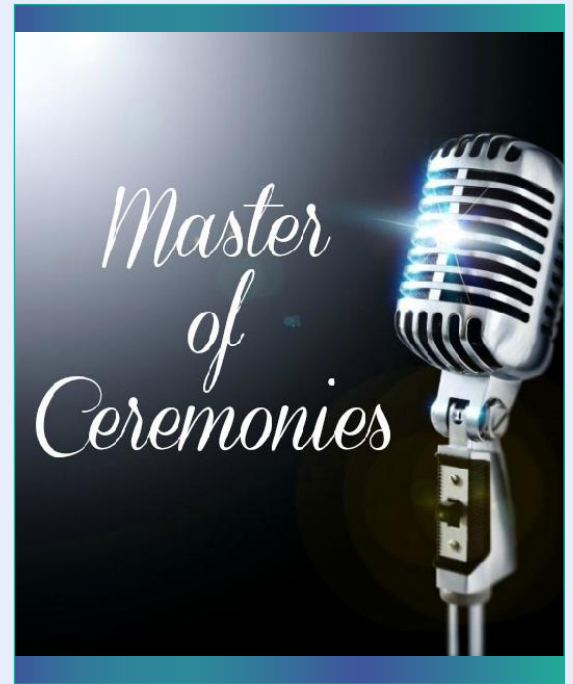
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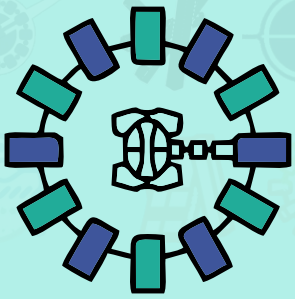

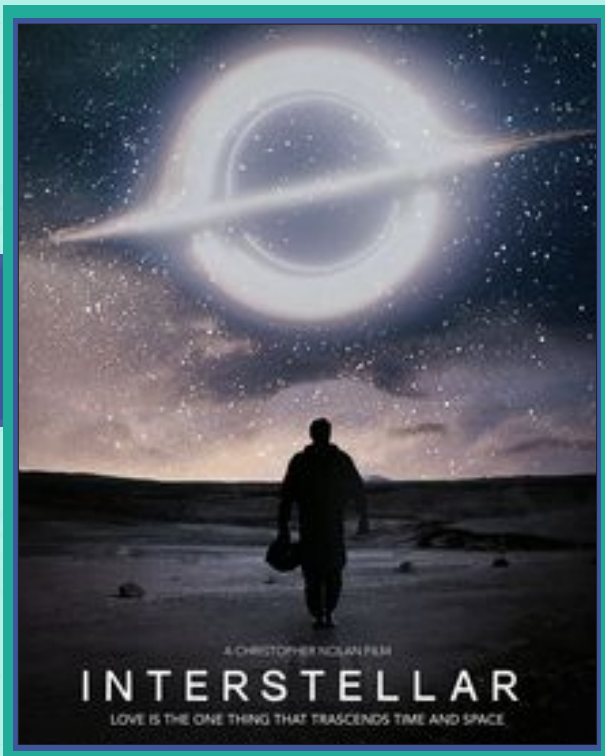
The flick that got the better of me

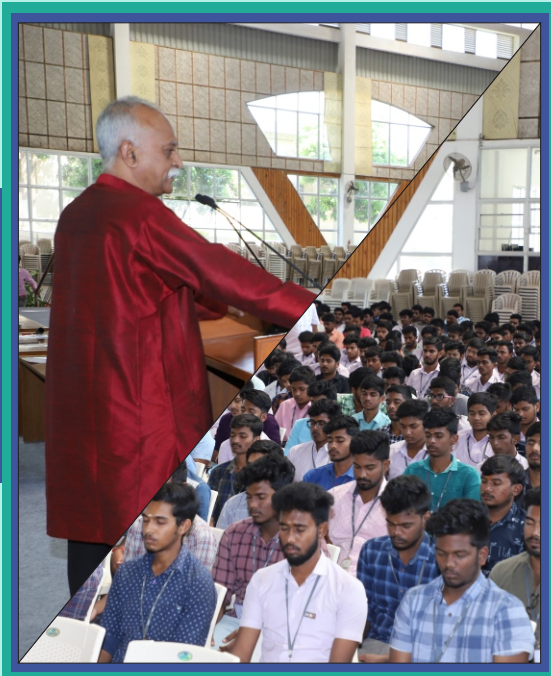
An exciting Experience

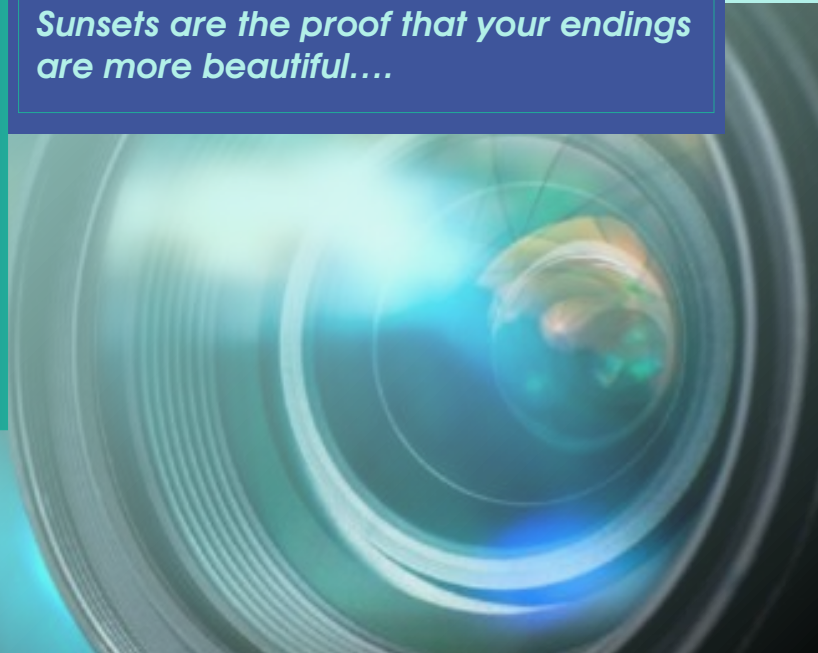
