Dr.A.Rathinavelu, Vice Principal, MCET gave the opening remarks for the programme and welcomed all the industry experts & admin team of MCET. The Industry experts for the programme are

Vice Principal discussed about the teaching learning practices, which includes one credit courses, special electives and other professional skills. He also highlighted the objective of the programme i.e. how to prepare the courses from industrial perspective and the challenges need to face in the industries.

Dr.G.Anupriya, Associate Professor, CSE, MCET introduced the industry experts.

Highlights of Experts' Talk:

Mr.S.Kameswaran outlined the interaction between Servion and MCET. He emphasized the importance of the quote, "Knowledge workers are workers whose main capital is knowledge". He also addressed the following aspects:

- Myth about software industries.
- Experience of Servion freshers in their college life.
- Stressed the importance of self-learning in industries.
- Continuous change and growth in industrial perspective.

Mrs.Indu Padamanaban has started the talk by stating that engineers should have the interest to learn new things at any time. The students must be strong in the programming concepts. Students can also learn business ethics that is required for an IT industry. Team work is most important for the engineers. She stressed that students can do combined projects to build team work.

Mr.VishnuPrasad initiated his session by introducing the expectation of IT industry from the fresher. He stated that the individual can be strong in specific language as the basics in all the languages are almost similar. He also encouraged the students to do inter-disciplinary projects from third year. It gives them better understanding in all the fields with practical approach. Students can opt for internship during their final year. It showcases them to how IT is and how to work in IT industry.

Mr.Kannan started with, "The demand in IT industry and supply of man power". He shared points about Indian IT industry. He informed that, the students' should have a curiosity to solve problems. He stressed out the basic skills needed from fresh engineers. He also motivated the students to become an entrepreneur. It creates an opportunity by the youngster for the youngster. He ended his session by providing career tips for the first year students.
